



## Impact of Sports Premium 2019-20

We were allocated £17,810 and £16,469 on sports last year.

Our key aims were to

- expand our involvement in inter-school sports matches
- introduce new sports to our children e.g. curling, tag-rugby
- maintain a stock of quality resources for our children to use
- continue to increase the level of skill that that children had and improve the quality of teaching in PE.

The impact of the spending was as follows:

- There is a clear skills progression within lessons and across year groups and assessment opportunities are clearly identified
- Participation in sports clubs continues to be high
- The introduction of netball as an extra-curricular club, the formation of a competitive team and a netball court marked out in our school hall
- Children are engaging with other pupils from schools within the locality, applying taught skills and fostering a culture of team comradery and competition
- Pupils engagement and enjoyment within PE lessons has increased
- There was an increase in the percentage of children reaching the expected level for physical development
- New sports were introduced in school, e.g., orienteering, tag-rugby and curling.
- During pupil interviews, the children's feedback was positive, highlighting their enjoyment of learning new skills across a broad range of activities.
- An inter-house sports competition each Tuesday afternoon in which ALL children participate
- A pre – school sports session for breakfast club members
- Teaching Assistants were able to support in PE lessons

### Swimming and Water Safety

What percentage of your Year 6 pupils could swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres when they left your primary school at the end of last academic year?	88%
What percentage of your Year 6 pupils could use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke] when they left your primary school at the end of last academic year?	71%
What percentage of your Year 6 pupils could perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations when they left your primary school at the end of last academic year?	30%
